Polling Locations and Voting Period

- ► Polling Location: Embassy or additional polling station
- ➤ Voting Period: May 20 (Tue.) May 25 (Sun.), 2025 (The specific period is designated by the Overseas Election Commission.)
- ➤ Voting Hours: 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- Details on the polling locations and voting periods for each overseas polling station will be posted on the websites of the National Election Commission, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Overseas Koreans Agency, and each overseas mission prior to the overseas voting period.



Voting Procedure

- Present your identification document to verify your identity. After confirmation, receive your ballot paper and return envelope.
- 2 Enter the voting booth and mark(()) your choice for one candidate using the official marking tool in the designated area on the ballot paper.
- ③ Fold the marked ballot paper, insert it into the return envelope, seal the envelope using the double-sided tape, and exit the voting booth.
- 4 Place the sealed return envelope into the ballot box and leave the polling station.



Required Documents

- 1 Identification Document
- ➤ A valid ID issued by a Korean government agency or public institution with a photo that can verify the voter's identity, such as a passport or resident registration card
- ▶ Or, a valid ID issued by the government of the residing country (e.g., alien registration card) with a photo, full name, and date of birth that can confirm the voter's identity
- ② Original Certificate of Nationality Overseas voters must also bring the original certificate of nationality as officially announced by the overseas voting officer.
- * If the certificate of nationality includes a photo, it may be used alone without an additional identification document.



Invalid Ballot Conditions

- ► Use of a non-official ballot paper or nonofficial return envelope
- Submitting a return envelope into the ballot box without sealing it after marking the ballot
- ► Leaving all sections of the ballot blank (no selection made)
- ► Marking across two sections or selecting more than one section
- ► Making a mark that is unclear or illegible in identifying the selected section
- ➤ Writing letters or symbols instead of marking (♠) a selection
- Adding any information other than the official mark (()) on the ballot
- Using any marking tool other than the official one provided by the election commission
